

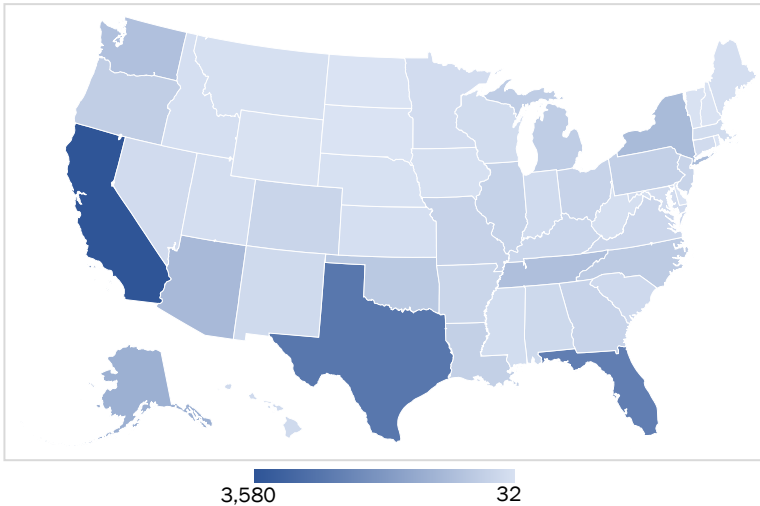
Unresolved Missing Persons Cases Published in NamUs Bi-Annual Report - January 2025

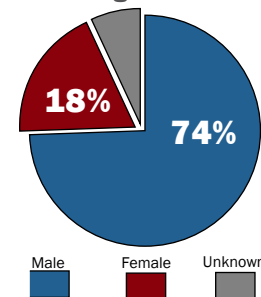

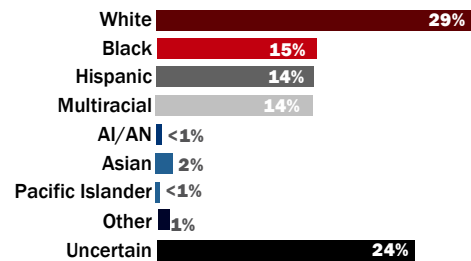
Age of Case

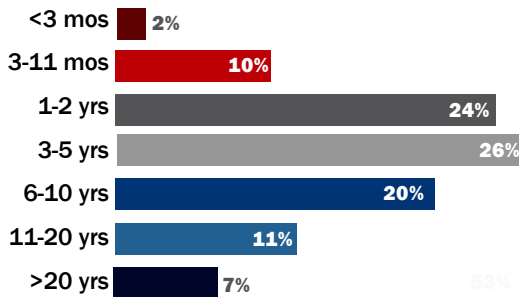

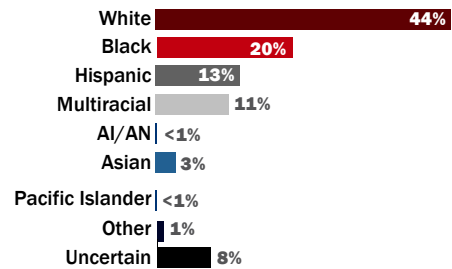
Sex Assigned at Birth

Sex Assigned at Birth

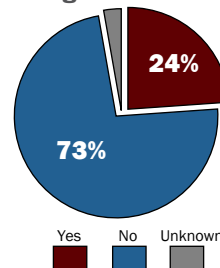


Age at Time of Missing

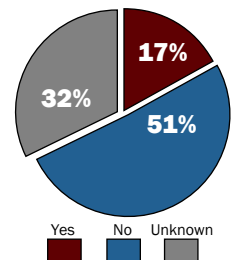

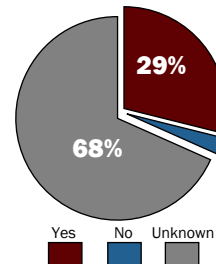
Missing from Tribal Land*

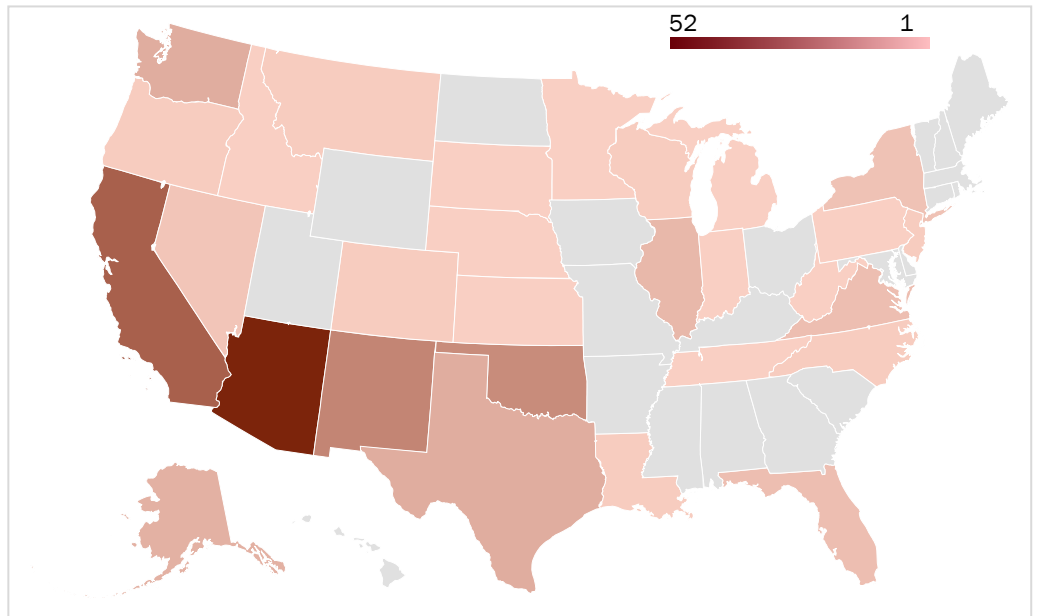

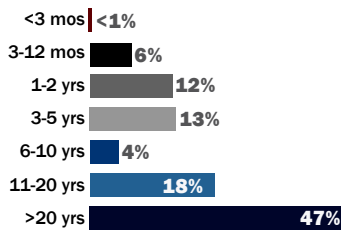

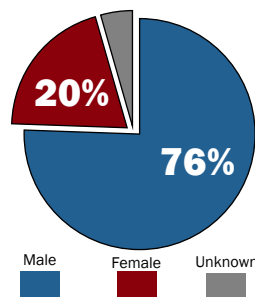

Age of Case



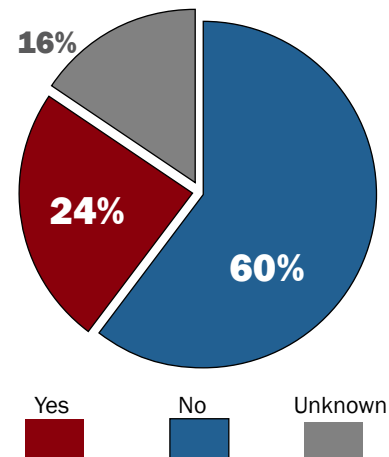

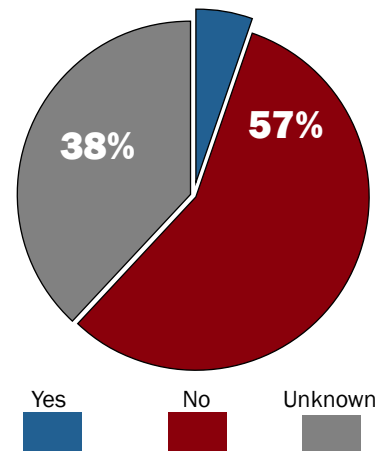


Sex Assigned at Birth
