

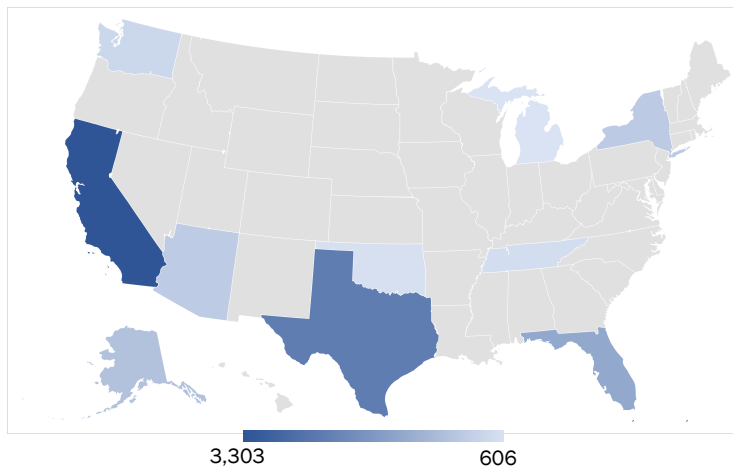
## Unresolved Missing Persons Cases Published in NamUs Bi-Annual Report - June 2023

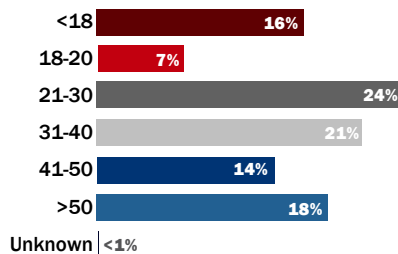

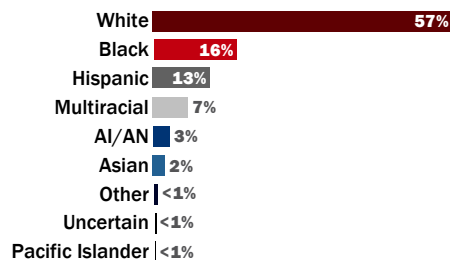
#### Sex Assigned at Birth

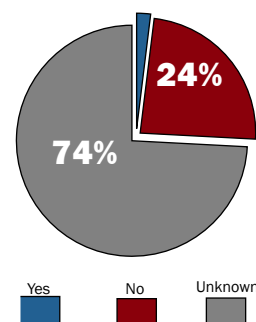

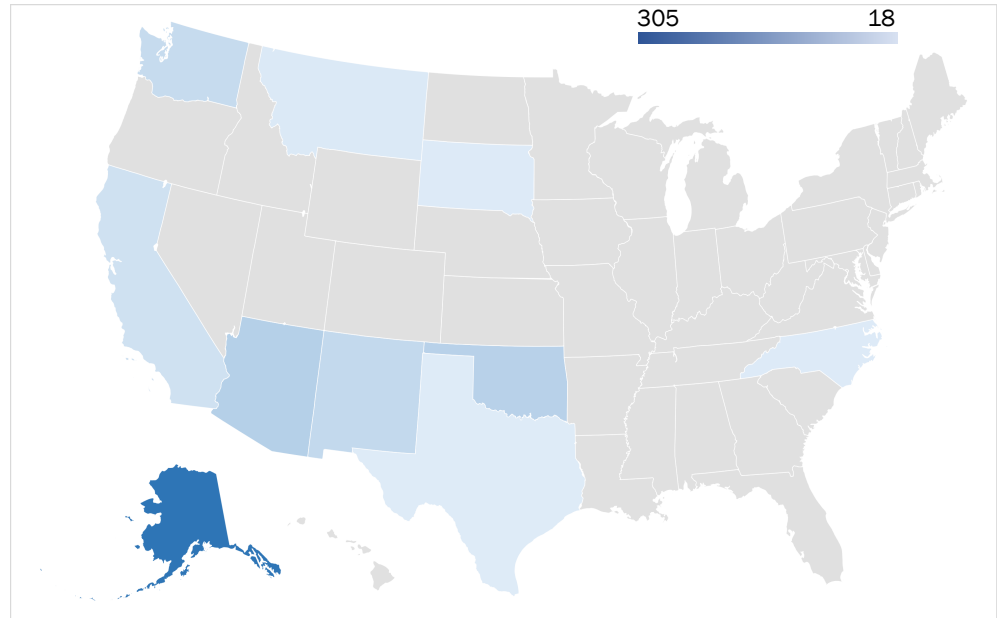

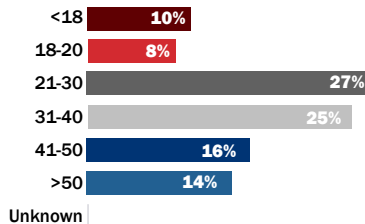
##### Age of Case



##### Sex Assigned at Birth

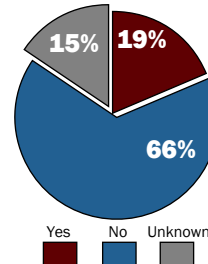


##### Age at Time of Missing

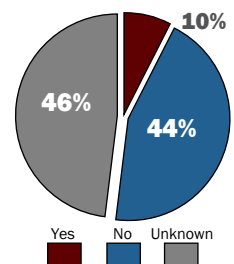
