

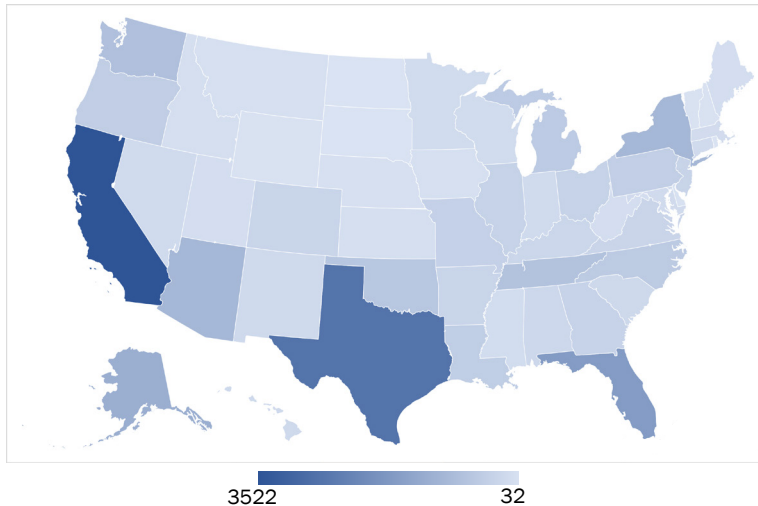
Unresolved Missing Persons Cases Published in NamUs Bi-Annual Report - June 2024

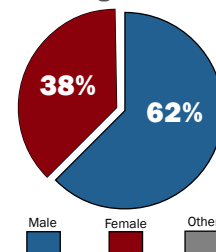

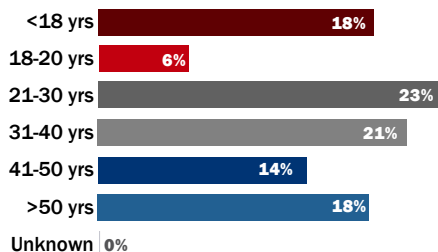

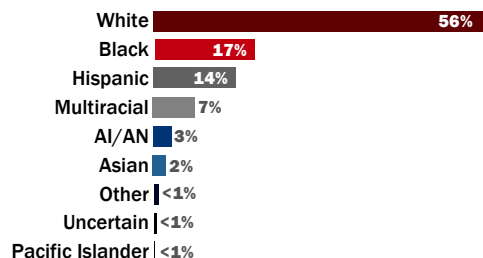
Sex Assigned at Birth

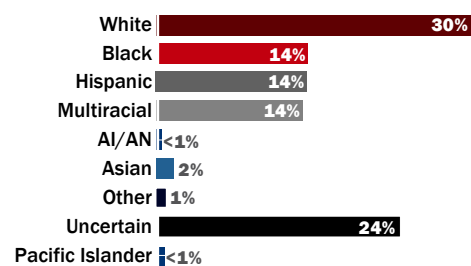
Age of Case

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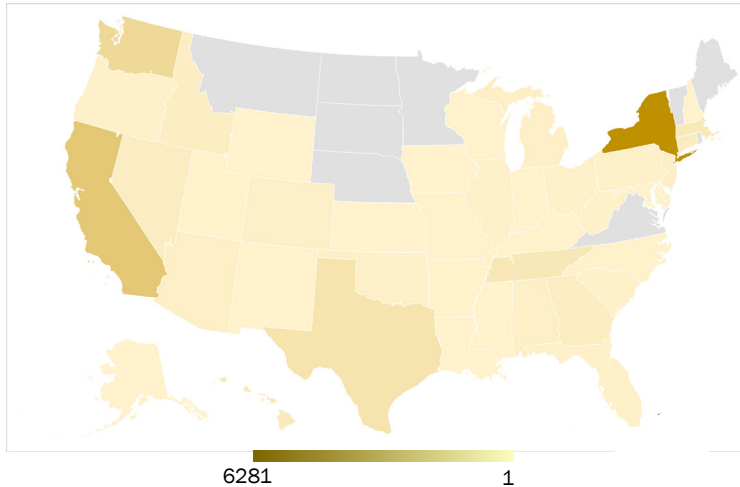

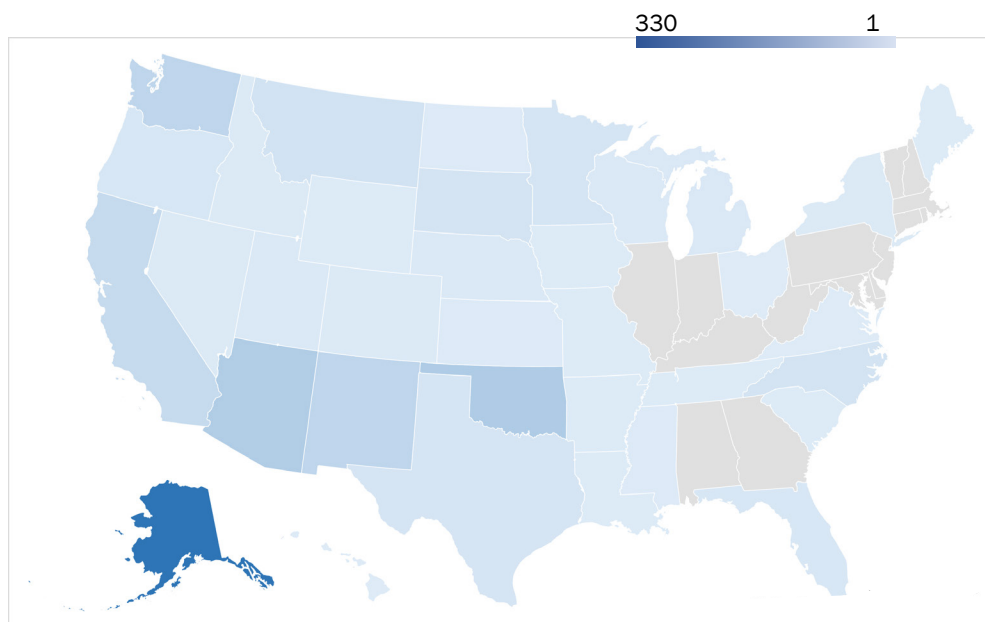

Sex Assigned at Birth

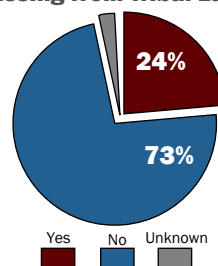


Age at Time of Missing

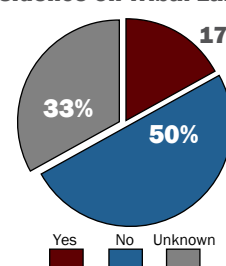

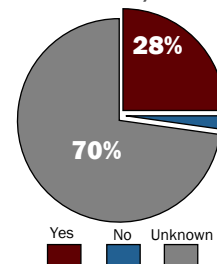
Missing from Tribal Land*

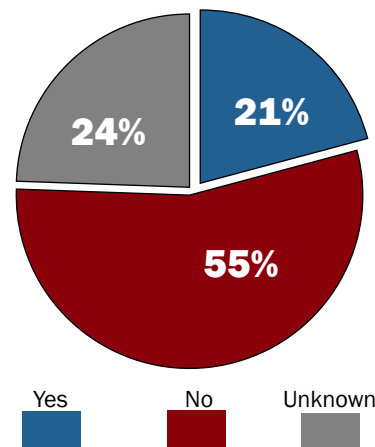


Sex Assigned at Birth

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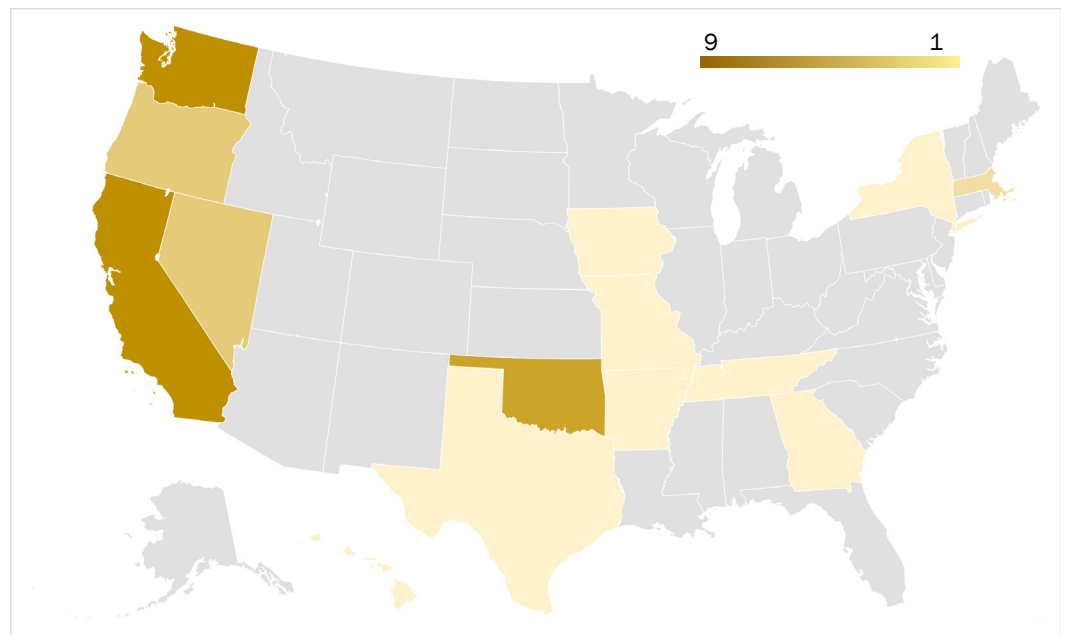

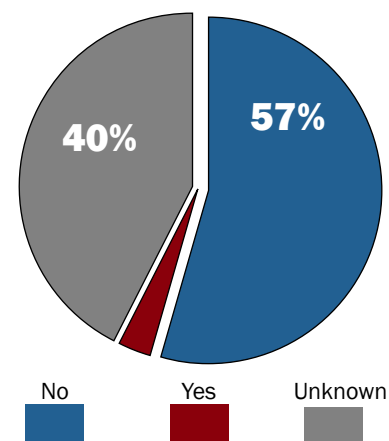


Sex Assigned at Birth
