

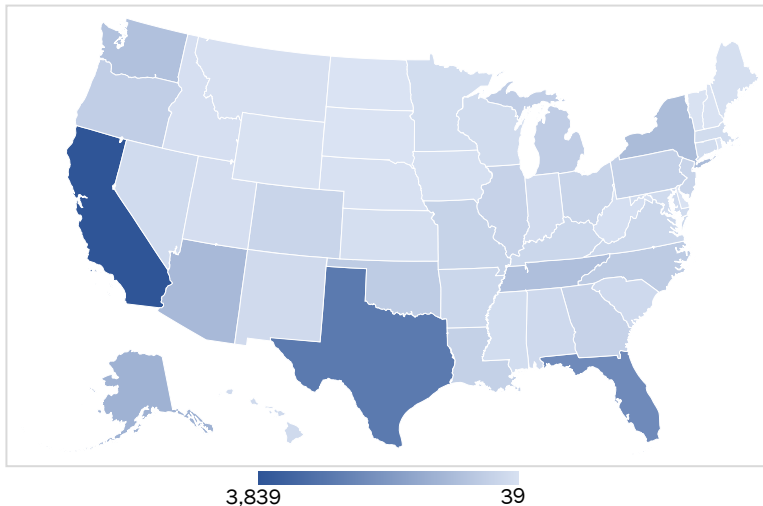
Unresolved Missing Persons Cases Published in NamUs Bi-Annual Report - June 2026

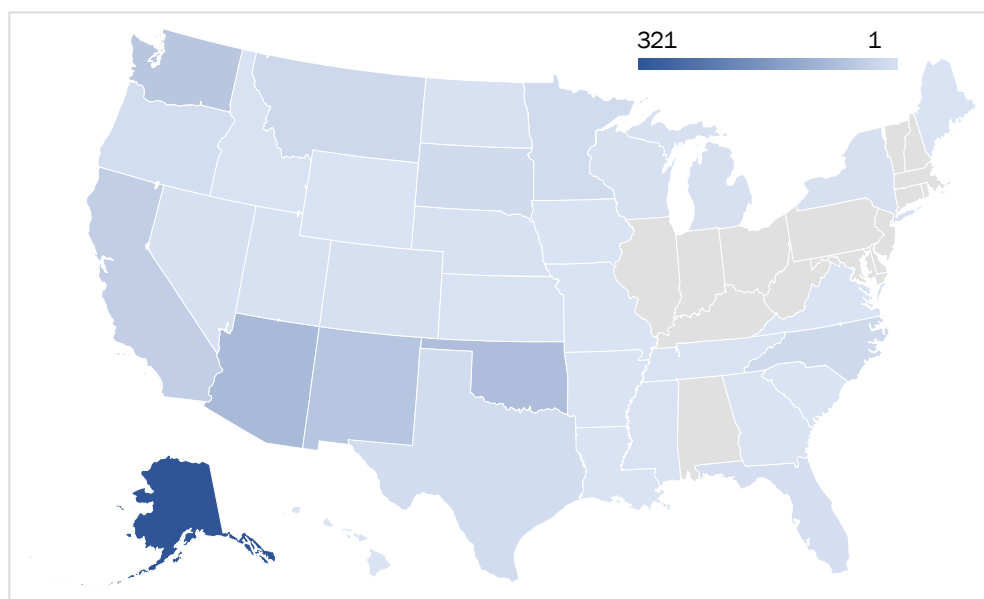

Sex Assigned at Birth

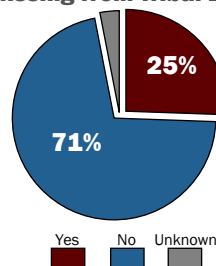


Age at Time of Missing

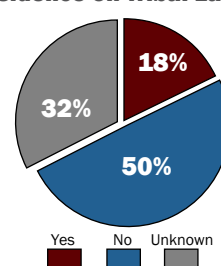

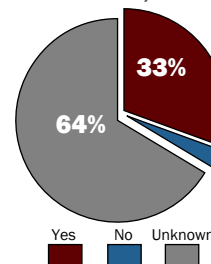
Missing from Tribal Land*

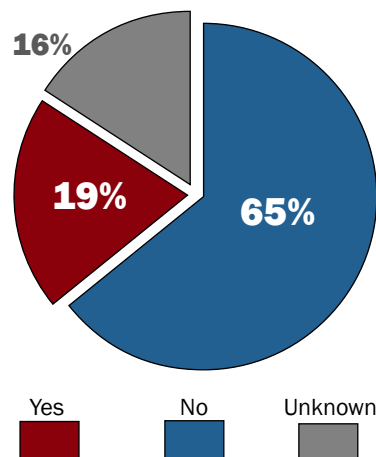

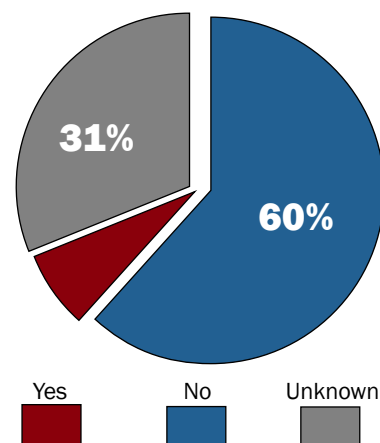


Sex Assigned at Birth
